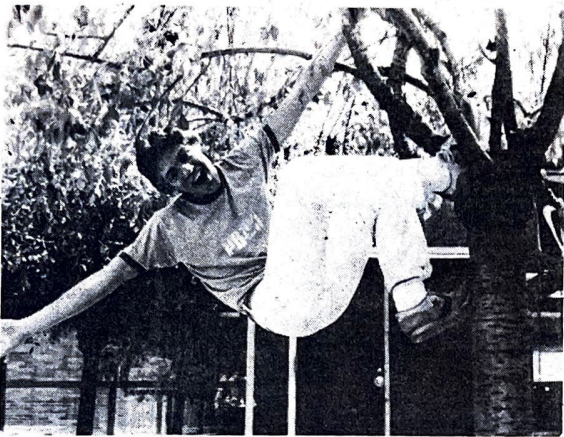

An Interview with Mr. Kase

The following article is a summary of an interview with Mr. James Kase, Great Valley principal, held on the thirteenth of May.

We started our interview with a discussion of recent events - specifically, the Variety Show. While Mr. Kase found the majority of the show to be entertaining, he felt "Variety" was a good name for the show, as some of the acts were in poor taste. Mr. Kase had received complaints from parents, faculty members, students in the audience, and students in the show, who felt not only that their sincere efforts had been smeared by the crudity and vulgarity of a few acts, but were also disappointed by an audience that was at times less than attentive. Although the Variety Show is on next year's calender, it will be cancelled unless modifications are made which will prevent similar events from reoccurring.

Next we discussed the athletic rules which penalize athletes who smoke, drink, or do drugs during a sports season. Mr. Kase said he approved of these rules, and, when asked why such rules shouldn't be extended to all extra-curricular activities, he said he saw no reason why these rules shouldn't apply to all students involved in any club or organization. But Mr. Kase also pointed out that sports are different from clubs, in that smoking can impair an athlete's performance. When told that an athlete's performance was an individual coach's concern and not that of the administration, Mr. Kase said he hesitated to let coaches form their own disciplinary actions, as such a policy might lead to conflicts between coaches and players.

Next we discussed several aspects of the ROTC controversy. I asked him if maybe it wasn't a mistake to "negotiate" with an impromptu organization like the Concerned Students of Great Val-

ley instead of using established organizations like the ASB. Mr. Kase said that the CSGV wasn't really an organization, but rather a group of students concerned not so much about the ROTC as they were with those extra-curricular activities they themselves valued, who had grown concerned with the ASB's lack of input into the situation. He talked to them in order to avoid a walkout which Mr. Kase considered nothing less than ludicrous. He also told them that if they expected to make progress, they should work with the ASB instead of competing with it.

The other aspect of the ROTC's controversy was that the school board's decision to cancel the program was indicative of their ability to sneak decisions by the very individuals who will be most affected by their actions. Mr. Kase said that the school board had no such ability. In fact, another unpopular decision, that of putting black slate on the windows, had been discussed at two school board meetings before being acted upon. Nonetheless, Mr. Kase felt that both the board and the student body could benefit if a student were put on the school board in an advisory capacity. He has seen such an arrangement in various forms throughout this area, and feels that though the job would be time consuming for the student, the capacity for the students to express their opinions directly to the school board would be worth it.

The last issue discussed was the one of gym uniforms. It is possible that next year, students will have to buy and wear uniforms for gym. Mr. Kase feels it is worth forcing students to use this uniform in order to make it more convenient for gym teachers who must decide whether or not to mark a student as unprepared.

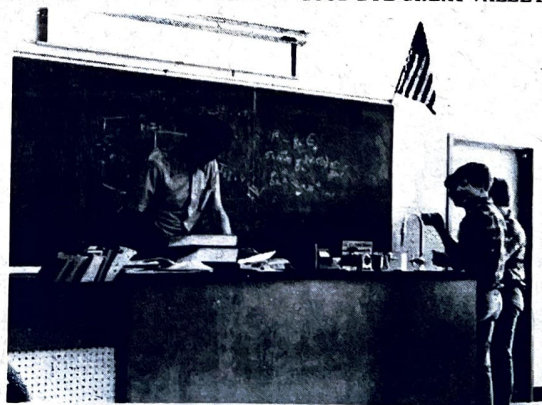

HATCH

The Pennsylvania Easter Seal Society has put fun and excitement into the process of choosing a career. Young people of high school age have an opportunity to attend the Easter Seal program, "Health And The Challenge," called HATCH, to acquaint them with the many careers available in rehabilitation. These careers may be nursing, therapy, special education, psychology, medicine or the many opportunities associated with these professions.

In its 15th year, the HATCH Program will offer these young people an opportunity to participate in programs through field trips, demonstrations, and camp living. They will be able to explore in depth the opportunities in health careers that are available throughout the state.

In addition to exposure to physical, occupational and speech therapy, field trips will be made to local hospitals, workshops, Easter Seal Rehabilitation Centers and schools for the handicapped. Sessions will also include Rehabilitation Counseling, Nursing, Recreational Therapy, Social Work and Special Education, and will be conducted by professionals in the respective fields. "I am glad that I came to the HATCH Program. I have learned so much about myself and what I want to do in the future. I think it is a wonderful program," commented one of last year's participants. Some HATCH students have later become Counselors for the Easter Seal camps and have continued their study in the health professions. Others, through this program, have realized that being a rehabilitation professional is not what they desire, and this has exemplified the purpose of the program to help young people in choosing the right career.

A session will be held this year at Camp Easter Seal, Laurel Hill State Park, near Somerset, from July 4 to July 15, 1982; a second session will be held at Camp Daddy Allen, Hickory Run State Park, White Haven from July 18 to July 29, 1982. These two camps are two of four summer camps operated by The Pennsylvania Easter Seal Society to extend camping to handicapped children and adults. The cost is \$150.00 per session.

"What do I want to do with myself?" That's the question asked the most as Graduation Day approaches. For college-bound seniors who've asked themselves this old question, the U.S. Army Reserve may have the answer in a special officer training program that can earn qualified young people up to \$14,000 toward tuition.

The Simultaneous Membership Program, of SMP, as the program is known, makes it possible for young people to enroll in both the Army Reserve and the Army Reserve Officers Training Corps (ROTC) and collect an allowance for ROTC and Army Reserve pay for attending meetings. And since cadets are officers are officer trainees, their Reserve pay is higher.

This dual membership can mean earning up to \$14,000 for what is essentially a part-time job. In addition to attending ROTC classes on campus, cadets in their roles as Reservists devote just one weekend a month - only 16 hours - for drills at a nearby Reserve unit, and another two weeks for Annual Training, usually during the summer. This amounts to a total of just 38 days of Reserve duty a year.

The SMP benefits are not just financial. SMP lets cadets train in Army Reserve units and apply on a practical level the leadership principles and skills they learn in ROTC classes.

These leadership and management skills developed as a member of the Army Reserve and ROTC are important for career advancement, whether in civilian life or the military.

For Phillip Mobley, a University of South Carolina sophomore and Army Reservist who enrolled in SMP as a college freshman, the program has helped financially and professionally.

"The money I earn from the Army Reserve and ROTC," says Mobley, who will be commissioned a second lieutenant this spring, "makes it possible for me to afford college. But the program also gives me more than just money. It's taught me a whole range of leadership and administrative skills - things like time management, delegating responsibility and public speaking. The program's been very valuable."

Mobley has already decided what he wants to do when he graduates from the University of South Carolina. He intends to make the U.S. Army his career.

But Mobley's choice may not be everyone's and so SMP offers young men and women the opportunity, after completing the program, of choosing between serving in the Regular Army or the Army Reserve of National Guard.
